**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is a federally recognized Indian tribe organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 and all pertinent amendments thereof; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is governed by a Tribal Council made up of elected representatives who act in accordance with the powers granted to it by its Constitution and Bylaws; and

**WHEREAS,** the new Corn Creek Community Building is in jeopardy of losing the USDA funding amount of \$144,000.00 due to the threatened recapture of funds by USDA officials; and

**WHEREAS,** the total estimated cost of construction for this building is estimated to be \$483,893.00; and

**WHEREAS,** total obligated monies from federal sources are identified as USDA, \$144,000.00, SWA/HUD \$122,392.00, and ICDBG of \$94,893.00, the sum of \$120,960.00 is required from tribal dollars to meet the required 25% match against federal dollars for the total construction cost of \$483,833.00; and


**WHEREAS,** it is in the best interest of the health and welfare of the Community of Corn Creek to insure that this building is constructed; now

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Rosebud Sioux Tribe approves the allocation of \$120,960.00 from the social security monies returned from the IRS to the Rosebud Sioux Tribe.

Re: 2009 Reimbursement of (FICA) Social Security Benefits

Dear Budget and Finance Committee,

I am writing to you to try to get a decision made on the issue of the 2009 reimbursement of the (FICA) Social Security withholdings. In 2009 Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council was notified by the Rosebud Sioux Tribe's Treasurer Wayne Boyd, that as elected Council Representative we were not supposed to of had Social Security withheld from our pay checks and that the IRS would be reimbursing us for the past years we paid in, or for some a few months for the newly elected Council members.

Most of the Council members present and past signed letters asking for the reimbursements, those who didn't want to be reimbursed simply didn't sign the letters. We were told that even if you didn't ask for the reimbursement, the money paid in would not be applied to any kind of benefits; it would basically just sit in limbo. Most council asked to receive their reimbursements early and had the tribe get a line of credit to pay for this reimbursement.

Along with each individual contribution the employer (Rosebud Sioux Tribe) would match the employee's contribution. About a month ago I contacted Doug Lowery an IRS Agent out of Rapid City. This would be the same agent that worked with the Rosebud Sioux Tribe on our reimbursements. My question to Doug Lowery was that if we were reimbursed our social security benefits, which would be considered a retirement fund and which Doug Lowery also referred to as retirement, would we get the employer's (Rosebud Sioux Tribe) match as well? Doug answered, that would be up to the Tribe.

With most retirement plans the employee makes a contribution and the employer will match that contribution. For example an early withdrawal from a (401k) plan the employee would have to pay some type of penalty for early withdrawal but they would still receive the match from their employer. I believe that if we treat our Social Security Retirement the same we should also receive the Tribe's match as well.

I have spoken to a number of Council Representatives and they too would like a decision be made on this issue. This issue has been to the council in the past but no decision was made and it was treated as Council was trying to get something that they shouldn't receive.

On behalf of others and myself I ask that a decision made on this issue.

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Indian Reorganization (Howard-Wheeler) Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) and all pertinent Amendments, thereof.

**WHEREAS,** the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is governed by a Tribal Council made up of elected representatives who act in accordance with the powers granted to it by its Constitution and By-Laws.

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with Federal Law governing Equal Opportunity Employment the employer is responsible to deducted from all eligible employees all federal taxes from the employee's gross earning and to pay any/all matching payment for each eligible employed individual, in the name of the employee; and

**WHEREAS,** the United States Social Security Administration reimbursed to the eligible individual RST Council representatives the total payment of Social Security Tax made by the RST Finance Department for each eligible individual; and

**WHEREAS,** the RST Treasurer advised the RST Council representatives and administration that the Social Security Tax reimbursement payment was to be made after the new year, and also advised that partial payment could be made before the Christmas holiday if he was allowed to set up a line of credit to make partial payment. RST Council representatives signed a document allowing the Rosebud Sioux Tribe the ability to file for their total individual reimbursement from the Social Security Tax; and

**WHEREAS,** partial payment was made to all the RST elected officials eligible for reimbursement through a loan, and was advised by the RST Treasurer that once the Tribe received the total reimbursement payment, from the IRS for Social Security Tax for the eligible individuals, the remaining balance will be disbursed; and

**WHEREAS,** in a special RST Council meeting on April 19, 2011, Motion that the Tribe refund to the individuals who received the Social Security reimbursement the tribal match paid to Social Security Tax and to direct Finance to make that available to us by Thursday. Motion was carried nine (9) in Favor; zero (0) against; two (2) Not Voting.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the tribal council of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe acknowledges and accepts the motion to payout the remaining portion of the Social Security Tax re-imbursement and directs the RST Treasurer to make the payment to the eligible individuals immediately, and hereafter this issue be laid moot.






